MOUNTAIN WALKS IN CROATIA

In Croatia, mountains cover 21% of the country's surface and are of utmost importance due to the biodiversity and natural heritage they preserve. The strength of Croatia's mountain regions lies in their potential for rural and agricultural development, the timber industry, and summer and winter tourism. The biggest challenges are depopulation and unemployment, leading to a steady exodus of people from the mountains.

The implementation of the European Cohesion Policy has supported the sustainable development of mountainous territory, leading to the creation of new jobs and new tourism opportunities such as the creation of the Routes of the Frankopans cultural and tourist route. Other improvements include better waste management with the new recycling centre at Delnice and greater energy efficiency, for example the energy renovation of Ivan Goran Kovačić Vrbovsko elementary school.

Teaching assistants were hired to support special needs students in the school. There is a child with special needs in Vesna's class. The new teaching assistant facilitates her classroom work by helping this pupil.

3 RECYCLING

A recycling centre was built close to Kristina's house in Delnice. Kristina has started sorting her waste and taking it to the recycling centre. In this way, she has reduced her waste bills and is setting a good example to her children.

2 ELDERLY CARE

Through the Wish women's employment programme, 7 women from the municipality of Skrad were employed to assist elderly people.
One of these women cares for Kristina's grandmother, so that she no longer has to pay a career and has more time to spend with her children.

WORK

RAVNA received funding to buy new machines and expand its business. Kristina's job is now less tiring. She no longer suffers from back pain and does not need physiotherapy anymore.
